2nd Call for Proposals for Small Projects

This document outlines the terms and conditions that apply specifically to the 2nd call for proposals launched by the Interreg VI-A Lithuania-Poland cooperation programme (hereinafter – Programme). More general information on rules and requirements to be observed when applying for funding can be found in the Programme Manual, applicable for the 2nd Call for Proposals, which is available at the <u>Programme website</u>.

General Information

On 26 September 2022 the European Commission adopted the decision No C(2022) 6938 for approval of the cooperation programme "(Interreg VI-A) Lithuania-Poland" for support from the ERDF under the European territorial cooperation goal (Interreg) in Lithuania and Poland for the period from 1 January 2021 to 31 December 2027.

The overall objective of the Programme is improving wellbeing of cross-border communities through cross-border cooperation and sustainable use of cultural and natural heritage of the Lithuania and Poland cross-border area. While preparing project proposals, this objective should be considered as guiding principle for generating project ideas and developing activities. All projects have to comply with EU and national legal frameworks and basic principles. Cross-border relevance has to be building stone of every project and cooperation, project outputs and results should be clearly linked to Programme objectives. For this reason, projects should carefully consider this document and guidelines provided in Programme documents. Programme intends to select high quality projects which contribute to tackling the cross-border challenges identified in the Programme area.

Priorities open for the 2nd Call for Proposals (small projects)

When selecting projects to be funded, allocation may be adapted by the monitoring committee (MC) according to Programme needs.

The ERDF co-financing rate is up to 80 %. Beneficiaries have to ensure the needed co-financing.

Eligible Applicants

Each project has to have at least one partner from each country (Lithuania and Poland). The main types of applicants that can participate in the Programme are: local, regional and national authorities; public bodies and bodies governed by the public law; associations; NGOs; European Grouping of Territorial Cooperation (EGTCs). Bodies governed by public law means entities that have all of the following characteristics¹:

- they are established for the specific purpose of meeting needs in the general interest, not having an industrial or commercial character;
- they have legal personality; and
- they are financed, for the most part, by the State, regional or local authorities, or by other bodies governed by public law; or are subject to management supervision by those authorities or bodies; or have an administrative, managerial or supervisory

board, more than half of whose members are appointed by the State, regional or local authorities, or by other bodies governed by public law.

- Small and Medium Enterprises (SMEs) – only as a Project Partner for Priority 2, Specific Objective 2.2/RSO4.6.

Any of the eligible applicants can take the Lead Partner role (except for SME).

Applicants located outside the programme area but within the EU can also apply for funding as Lead/project partners, however such partners have to bring a clear benefit to the Programme.

How to apply

Applicants have to fill in the Application Form through Joint Electronic Monitoring System (JEMS) online at <u>jems.lietuva-polska.eu</u>. Offline Application Form as well as Guidelines on filling the Application Form are available on the Programme website at <u>www.lietuva-polska.eu</u>, these are for informational purposes online, to provide support for filling the official Application Form.

Please note that only Application Forms submitted through the JEMS portal are eligible! Any Applications sent by e-mail or post will not be assessed.

The Call for Proposals will open on 9 January 2024. The **deadline** for submission of proposals is:

29 February 2024 at 17:00 Lithuanian time
